


1 Procedure. The inmate mailed a copy of the prisoner's electronically filed document
2 to non-registered users.

3 5. NNCC established an email address for receipt of NEFs of documents filed
4 electronically. NNCC staff printed the NEFs and the hyperlinked order and other
5 documents filed by the Court. Receipt of copies of the NEFs and hyperlinked
6 documents by the prisoner constituted service of the document on the prisoner. If the
7 prisoner refused delivery or is no longer at NNCC, staff indicated the reason for non-
8 delivery on the NEF and emailed it to the Court.

9 6. Opposing parties that are CM/ECF registered users served filings on NNCC prisoners
10 by CM/ECF. NNCC staff printed and provided to prisoners NEFs and the hyperlinked
11 documents filed by opposing parties.

12 The Court, the NDOC, and the Office of the Attorney General have evaluated the pilot project
13 and determined it should be continued permanently at NNCC, and that the e-filing project should be
14 expanded to other NDOC facilities on a schedule agreed upon by the Court, the NDOC, and the Office
15 of the Attorney General.



GENERAL ORDER NO. 2012-01
ADDENDUM TO SECOND AMENDED

Beginning September 1, 2015, the Court will receive all inmate Section 1983 filings via email from Lovelock Correctional Center (“LCC”). LCC staff will scan to PDF and email to the Court all documents presented by prisoners for filing with the Court in Section 1983 cases only. The original documents will be returned to the prisoner after scanning. This process shall be permanent and mandatory in Section 1983 cases beginning September 1, 2015. Any prisoner who seeks to continue to send documents to the Court by U.S. mail must motion the Court, and show good cause, for such permission. The Court shall exercise its discretion in granting such requests on an individual basis.
