


ACCESS TO COURTHOUSE
BY VISITORS TO
CONGRESSIONAL OFFICES

SPECIAL ORDER NO. 101

Local Rule IA 9-1(d) states the following: "No person shall carry or possess pagers, cellular telephones, two way radios, or other transmitting devices in any United States Federal Building and Courthouse in this district without the express prior approval of the United States Marshal or a United States circuit judge, district judge, bankruptcy judge, or magistrate judge." This special order hereby authorizes visitors to congressional offices located within the federal courthouses in the District of Nevada to possess pagers, cellular telephones, two way radios, or other transmitting devices. If the Court Security Officers have not received advance notice from the Congressional office that the visitor is expected, they will contact the Congressional office prior to permitting the visitor access to the courthouse with the electronic equipment referred to above. The Court Security Officers are also requested to inform these visitors that these devices are not to be taken to other locations within the courthouse without the approval of the U.S. Marshal or a judicial officer.
