




1 United States District Judge, it has been necessary for Law

14 ORDER


15 It appearing to the Court that because of the exigency  
16 of public business a work emergency did and continued to  
17 exist during the month of December 1984, that precluded Law  
18 Clerk JAMES R. CHAMBERLAIN from taking his annual leave as  
19 heretofore scheduled. NOW, THEREFORE,

20 IT IS ORDERED that, for purposes of documentation of  
21 restored leave, a work emergency be, and is hereby, declared  
22 for the month of December 1984. Pursuant to Title 5,  
23 Section 6304(d)(1)(B), United States Code, all accrued  
24 annual leave in excess of the maximum allowable carryover  
25 (240 hours) for the 1984 leave year that has not been used  
26

1 by the end of the 1984 leave year (January 6, 1985), and  
2 that would otherwise be lost, shall be restored to Law Clerk  
3 JAMES R. CHAMBERLAIN. The restored annual leave shall be  
4 used no later than the end of the 1986 leave year (January  
5 4, 1987) as provided for under Title 5, Section 6304(d)(2),  
6 United States Code, and as prescribed by Chapter 16, Section  
7 3 at 1603.8 of the Manual for Clerks of the United States  
8 District Courts. Any portion of the restored annual leave  
9 that is not used as provided herein shall be forfeited.
