Unless otherwise ordered by the court,

- An eligible graduate of Old College School of Law (now known and hereinafter referred to as "Nevada School of Law, Old College"), acting under the supervision of a member of the bar of this court may appear before a United States District Judge or United States Magistrate on behalf of inmates of Nevada State prisons who are instituting civil rights or habeas corpus proceedings in this court, if the inmate has filed a written consent with the court.
- An eligible graduate of the Nevada School of Law, 2. Old College, must:
- (a) be certified by the Dean of the Nevada School of Law, Old College, as having graduated from and received the degree of Juris Doctor from the Nevada School of Law, Old College, Reno, Nevada;
 - (b) have knowledge of and be familiar with the Federal

Rules of Civil and Criminal Procedure and Evidence; and the Code of Professional Responsibility as specifically set forth in Local Rule 4(i)(2)(b); [and after July 1, 1986, the Model Rules of Professional Conduct as specifically set forth in Local Rule 120-8(c) which shall become effective on that datel; and all other Rules of this court;

- Bar of Nevada that the graduate has previously passed the Nevada State Bar Examination successfully pursuant to the Order Granting Conditional Relief to Old College School of Law of the Supreme Court of the State of Nevada dated January 2, 1985, but is not yet licensed to practice in the Nevada State Courts by reason of the provisions of that Order with respect to accreditation of the Nevada School of Law, Old College by the American Bar Association;
- (d) not accept compensation for his or her legal services directly from an inmate; and
- (e) file with the clerk all documents required to comply with this Special Order.
 - 3. The supervising attorney shall:
- (a) be admitted to practice before the highest court of any state for two years or longer and have been admitted to practice before this court;
 - (b) agree in writing to be the supervising attorney;
- (c) appear with the graduate in all oral presentations before the court;

- (d) sign all documents filed with the court;
- (e) assume professional responsibility for the graduate's work in matters before the court;
- (f) assist and counsel the graduate in the preparation of the graduate's work in matters before the court;
- (g) be responsible to supplement oral or written work of the graduate as necessary to ensure proper representation of the client; and
- (h) certify in writing that the graduate has knowledge of and is familiar with the Federal Rules of Civil and Criminal Procedure and Evidence; and the Code of Professional Responsibility as specifically set forth in Local Rule 4(i)(2)(b); [and if such certification is made subsequent to July 1, 1986, the Model Rules of Professional Conduct, as specifically set forth in Local Rule 120-8(c) which shall become effective on that date]; and all other Rules of this court.
- 4. The Dean's and Executive Director's certifications relating to the graduates:
- (a) shall be filed with the Clerk and shall remain in effect until August 31, 1988, unless sooner withdrawn with notice to the court.
- (b) may be withdrawn by the court at any time at the discretion of the court and without cause shown.
- 5. Upon fulfilling the requirements of this Special Order, the graduate may:
 - (a) assist in the preparation of briefs, motions and

other documents pertaining to a case before the court; and

- appear and make oral presentations before the court when accompanied by the supervising attorney.
- The graduate's eligibility to participate in proceedings under this Special Order terminates automatically on the date that the Nevada School of Law, Old College, notifies the court in writing that it has been officially provisionally accredited by the American Bar Association as an approved law school, or on August 31, 1988, whichever date is the earlier, unless the privilege to practice as provided herein is extended or otherwise ordered by the court.
- 7. The court retains the authority to establish exceptions to this Special Order in any case
