23 **I. CHARGING AND RELEASING MISDEMEANOR DEFENDANTS GENERALLY**

24 Authorized law enforcement personnel from the above-captioned agencies may issue
25 citations or violation notices to persons whom they have probable cause to believe are guilty of a
26 criminal misdemeanor offense consistent with Federal Rule of Criminal Procedure 58(b)(1),

1 applicable law, and within the limits prescribed for their agencies. As discussed in this Special
2 Order, below, persons charged on citation or violation notice may be released on a personal
3 recognizance bond and either (1) required to pay a fixed sum to the Central Violations Bureau
4 (CVB) in lieu of appearing in court or (2) required to appear in court on a fixed date and time
5 (“mandatory appearance”). Alternatively, within the sound judgment and discretion of the law
6 enforcement officer, persons charged within the jurisdictions of the above-captioned agencies with
7 misdemeanor offenses may be arrested and either (1) brought without unnecessary delay before a
8 duly appointed magistrate judge within the District of Nevada pursuant to Federal Rule of Criminal
9 Procedure 5(a) for their initial appearance, or (2) allowed to post bail securing their release and
10 given a mandatory appearance citation/violation notice requiring them to appear in court at a future
11 fixed date and time.

12 **II. FORFEITURE OF COLLATERAL IN LIEU OF APPEARANCE**

13 **(A) Forfeiture of Collateral - Generally**

14 Pursuant to Federal Rule of Criminal Procedure 58(d)(1), persons charged with certain
15 misdemeanors may, in lieu of appearance in court, post collateral in the amount indicated on the
16 charging document for the offense, waive appearance before a magistrate judge, and consent to
17 forfeiture of collateral, unless the charging document makes the person’s appearance in court
18 mandatory.

19 Collateral shall be posted by making payment to the Central Violations Bureau (CVB)
20 either by mail or online. The CVB’s payment mailing address is P.O. Box 71363, Philadelphia, PA,
21 19176-1363. The CVB’s online payment address is www.cvb.uscourts.gov.

22 Forfeiture of collateral constitutes a waiver of the right to contest the violation notice, of
23 the right to trial, and shall be deemed the equivalent of a conviction. Where the offense charged
24 qualifies as a Class A misdemeanor, forfeiture of collateral further constitutes waiver of the right
25 to be charged by Information and consent to be charged by citation or violation notice.

26 ///

1 **(B) Forfeiture of Collateral Schedule**

2 The offenses for which collateral may be posted and forfeited in lieu of appearance by the
3 person charged, together with the amount of collateral to be posted, are provided for in Exhibit A
4 attached hereto. The collateral amount shall also be indicated on the charging document in addition
5 to any processing fee that may be assessed by CVB.

6 **(C) Maximum Penalties in Lieu of Forfeiture of Collateral**

7 If a person charged with an offense under subsection (A), above, fails to post and forfeit
8 collateral in the amount indicated on the charging document, then a Notice to Appear shall be sent
9 to the person advising of the location, date and time of the court hearing regarding the matter. Upon
10 conviction by plea or after trial, a sentence including a fine, CVB processing fee, special assessment
11 pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3013, restitution pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3556, imprisonment, or probation,
12 may be imposed within the limits established by law.

13 **(D) Failure to Forfeit Collateral and Failure to Appear (FTA) Thereafter**

14 If a person charged with an offense under subsection (A), above, fails to post and forfeit
15 collateral, and then fails to appear for a duly scheduled hearing on the offense charged, and a
16 showing is made consistent with the provisions of Federal Rule of Criminal Procedure 58(d)(3), then
17 the magistrate judge may issue a warrant of arrest for that person.

18 Upon receipt of the warrant, the United States Marshal for this District may, in lieu of
19 execution thereof, give written notice before arrest to the person with a copy sent to the citing
20 agency that a warrant of arrest has issued for his or her arrest providing options to avoid arrest. If
21 the person fails to respond per the notice before arrest, the United States Marshal Service, or other
22 authorized officer, may execute the warrant of arrest consistent with applicable law.

23 **III. MANDATORY APPEARANCE IN COURT**

24 **(A) Mandatory Appearance - Generally**

25 Within the sound judgment and at the discretion of the citing officer, a person charged with
26 an offense may be issued a mandatory appearance citation or violation notice requiring the person

1 to appear in court to address the violation. The location, date and time of the hearing shall
2 subsequently be provided to the person charged via a Notice to Appear or a Summons. When issued
3 a mandatory appearance citation or violation notice, the charged person may not post and forfeit
4 collateral in lieu of personally appearing in court at the specified date and time.

5 **(B) Offenses For Which Mandatory Appearance May Be Required**

6 Those offenses for which mandatory appearance in court are required are stated as such in
7 Exhibit A, attached hereto. Additionally, with just cause under the circumstances, the citing officer
8 may determine that the violation requires mandatory appearance and reflect such requirement on the
9 charging document. In addition to the offenses noted in Exhibit A requiring mandatory appearance,
10 circumstances that may warrant mandatory appearance in other instances include, but are not limited
11 to, the following: (1) offenses involving loss or damage to the property of the United States or
12 others; (2) offenses involving a threat to the safety and/or welfare of law enforcement officers and
13 others; and (3) offenses that the person charged has a prior history of committing.

14 **(C) Failure to Appear in Court for Mandatory Appearance**

15 If the person charged fails to appear after a Notice to Appear or Summons has issued
16 advising the person of the location, date and time of the hearing, the magistrate judge may issue a
17 summons and provide a subsequent time and date for the hearing, or issue a bench warrant
18 authorizing arrest.

19 Upon receipt of the warrant, the United States Marshal for this District may, in lieu of
20 execution thereof, give written notice to the person that a warrant has issued for his or her arrest, and
21 must state in the notice that the warrant of arrest will not be executed if, within ten (10) days of the
22 notice the person voluntarily presents himself or herself before the magistrate judge during
23 usual business hours for the purpose of appearing at a hearing on the charged offense. If the person
24 fails to contact the United States Marshal Service and fails to appear within the specified time
25 period, the United States Marshal Service, or other authorized officer, may execute the warrant of
26 arrest consistent with applicable law.

1 **IV. APPEARANCE UPON ARREST**

2 **(A) Appearance After Arrest - Generally**

3 Nothing contained in this Special Order shall prohibit authorized law enforcement
4 personnel of the above-captions agencies from arresting a person for the commission of any offense,
5 including those for which collateral may be posted and forfeited, and upon such arrest,
6 taking the person without unnecessary delay before a magistrate judge in accordance with Federal
7 Rule of Criminal Procedure 5(a), or requiring the person charged to make a mandatory appearance
8 in court at a future date upon posting a custody release bond in a fixed amount.

9 **(B) Amount of Bond to be Posted to Secure Release After Arrest**

10 Persons deemed to have violated the law and taken into custody may be released upon
11 payment of a cash bond pursuant to procedures stated herein. The amount of bond to be posted is
12 set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto, unless otherwise stated. Within the discretion of the citing
13 officer, based upon justifiable circumstances, cash bond may be set up to the amount of ONE
14 THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1000.00) for any of the offenses listed in Exhibit A or for any other
15 misdemeanor offense charged.

16 **(C) Procedure for Collecting Bond and Documenting Release Conditions**

17 (1) **Appearance forms.** Posting of bail to secure release shall be evidenced
18 by execution of the approved form of **ORDER FOR APPEARANCE** and **APPEARANCE**
19 **BOND**, with attachment thereto of the written condition that the person cited and released is
20 required to appear before a magistrate judge of this district on a day and time, certain. Such Order
21 for Appearance and Appearance Bond, along with the attachment requiring the person's appearance
22 in court should be substantially similar to the documents included in Exhibit B, attached hereto.

23 (2) **Official receipt.** The above-captioned agencies may only accept
24 cash bail in the authorized and prescribed amounts against official receipt, noting the case incident
25 number on the receipt, the Order for Appearance and Appearance bond documents.

1 (3) **Deposit of bail funds with the Court.** Personnel of the above-captioned
2 agencies in receipt of cash bail funds shall promptly and fully deposit and make accounting for all
3 posted and received bail monies accepted by them as provided above, together with related citations
4 or violation notices and appearance bond paperwork, to the Clerk of the Court for this district, on
5 the very next succeeding workday that such cash bail is received.


6 **V. CHARGES ON COMPLAINT**

7 Nothing in this Special Order shall prohibit authorized personnel of the above-captioned
8 agencies from filing a complaint before a magistrate judge for any offense, including those for which
9 collateral may be posted and forfeited, in lieu of or superseding a violation notice or citation. **VI.**

10 **SUPERSEDING ORDER**

11 This Special Order supersedes Amended Special Order No. 60, filed July 17, 2013.

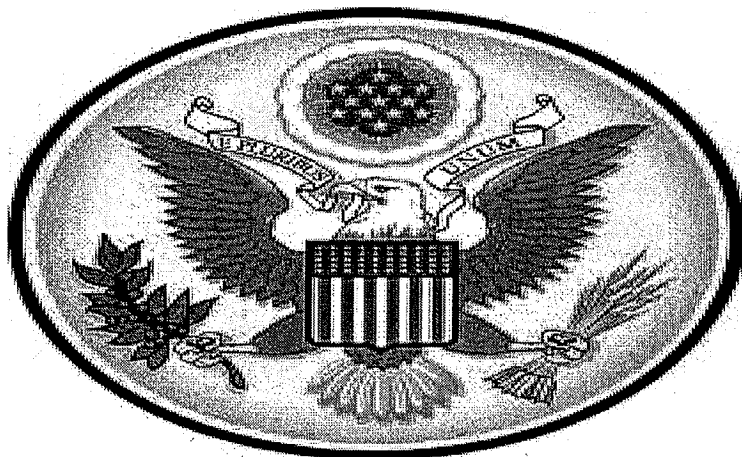
