Local Rule IA 2-1 (b) and (c) are superseded by this General Order. 10 PROHIBITED COMMUNICATION DEVICES Video and audio recorders, still cameras, and video cameras capable of recording, 11 12 reproducing, and transmitting (wireless or not) are not permitted in federal courthouses, unless 13 authorized under LR 1A 2-1 (e). 14 Exception: The presiding judge may authorize broadcasting, televising, recording, or 15 taking photographs in courtrooms and in adjacent areas during investitive, naturalization, or 16 other ceremonial proceedings. 17 RESTRICTED COMMUNICATION DEVICES Other electronic devices including wearable devices (e.g., Apple Watch), smartphones, 18 19 iPads, tablets, laptop computers, or other cellular-type communication equipment are permitted 20 21 22 23 Apple Watch), in the jury room during court proceedings. 24 25

in courtrooms and hearing rooms only if they are turned off, or on silent, vibrate, or airplane mode. Use of these devices for communication is only permitted outside of courtrooms and hearing rooms. Note: jurors must leave electronic devices, other than wearable ones (e.g., Exceptions: U.S. Marshals, court security officers, and court staff are permitted to use devices for communication in courtrooms or hearing rooms as required to perform their official duties. Attorneys are permitted to use devices at the counsel table during their proceeding; however, attorneys are not permitted to make or receive phone calls in courtrooms or hearing rooms.

## PROHIBITED TYPES OF COMMUNICATION

The following types of communication are prohibited in courtrooms and hearing rooms (except when authorized for ceremonial proceedings as noted above): video and audio recording, live streaming video; posting videos, texts, and pictures to the internet including social media (e.g., Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Snapchat, YouTube, and Periscope); or posting content instantaneously to blogs and other websites.
