IN RE: ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENT OF FACE COVERINGS FOR ACCESS TO THE COURTHOUSES DUE TO CIRCUMSTANCES CREATED BY COVID-19 AND RELATED CORONAVIRUS

TEMPORARY GENERAL ORDER 2020-08

In response to the recent outbreak of the coronavirus disease 2019 ("COVID-19") in the District of Nevada, the Court has issued a series of general orders changing how the Court operates to do its part in containing the spread of COVID-19. See Temporary General Orders 2020-02, 2020-03, 2020-04, 2020-05.¹ As the Court incrementally resumes in-person hearings, in a phased approach based on recommended health guidelines, the Court finds it necessary to adopt additional protocols for access to the United States District Court for the District of Nevada courthouses in Reno and Las Vegas ("the Courthouses"). General Order 2020-02 prohibits individuals who exhibit COVID-19 symptoms, or have had contact with COVID-19-positive individuals, from entering the Courthouses. That Order remains in effect. This Order imposes additional requirements in light of recommendations from public health officials that we all wear face coverings to prevent the spread of COVID-19 where social distancing measures

are difficult to implement.² The Court therefore orders the following protocols for use of face coverings effective May 18, 2020.

- 1) During court proceedings, everyone inside the courtroom is required to wear a face covering, to the extent practical and where social distancing measures are difficult to maintain. The presiding judge may modify this requirement for particular court proceedings.
- 2) All employees of the United States District Court for the District of Nevada must wear face coverings during security screening and while they are in public areas of the Courthouses. Employees who have contact with members of the public outside of court proceedings as described above are required to wear face coverings during their interactions. The Court will provide face coverings for employees.
- 3) Members of the public are encouraged, but not required, to wear face coverings during security screening and while they are in public areas of the Courthouses. The Court will provide face coverings for members of the public who come to the Courthouses for court-related businesses without a face covering, provided that the Court has a sufficient supply.

4) The requirement of wearing face coverings established herein does not apply to individuals who cannot wear a face covering due to a medical condition.

This Order is effective until further notice.
