IN RE: CLERK'S OFFICE CLOSURE AND FURTHER RESTRICTIONS ON COURT OPERATIONS UNDER THE EXIGENT CIRCUMSTANCES CREATED BY COVID-19 AND RELATED CORONAVIRUS

TEMPORARY GENERAL ORDER 2020-04

This General Order is being issued in response to the recent outbreak of the coronavirus disease 2019 ("COVID-19") in the District of Nevada, and follows a March 16, 2020, Temporary General Order ("GO 2020-03") suspending jury trials and non-case related events for some time. (See Temporary General Order 2020-03.)¹ In the brief time since the Court issued GO 2020-03, the COVID-19 pandemic has continued to spread in the country in general—and in this district in particular—resulting in additional emergency declarations² and widespread calls for the public to take more aggressive

social-distancing measures.³ On March 17, 2020, the Governor of the State of Nevada ordered the closure of many business establishments and strongly encouraged all citizens to stay home.⁴ In light of these rapidly escalating events, and to do its part to help protect the safety and health of all those entering and working in the District's courthouses from the spread of COVID-19, the Court HEREBY FURTHER ORDERS the temporary closure of the Clerk's Office for the United States District Court for the District of Nevada ("Clerk's Office") and the implementation of other changes to currently scheduled hearings as follows:

A. Clerk's Office

- 1) The Clerk's Office will be closed to the public beginning March 20, 2020. This closure does not affect any filings. Attorneys and *pro* se parties may continue to file documents with the Court. All deadlines will remain in full effect unless otherwise ordered by the presiding judge.
- 2) Filings will be processed via the electronic filing system (CM/ECF) and via mail or delivery. Paper documents delivered to the courthouses must be deposited in drop boxes located in the lobbies of the Lloyd D. George Federal Courthouse in Las Vegas located at 333 Las Vegas Blvd. South, Las Vegas NV 89101 and the Bruce R. Thompson Federal Courthouse located at 400 S.

Virginia Street, Reno NV 89501. Drop-box access will be available between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on business days. Filings sent by mail will be deemed filed on the date indicated on the postage date stamp. Manual filings may be served on opposing parties without securing a file stamped copy.

- 3) Payments by check or money order will be accepted by mail or in the courthouse drop boxes during the hours noted above. Cash payments will not be accepted during this period of exigent circumstances.
- 4) Staff in the Clerk's Office will be available by telephone, mail will be received, and new filings will be processed. Contact information for the Clerk's Office in Las Vegas is: (702) 464-5453; contact information for the Clerk's Office in Reno is: (775) 686-5800.

B. Court Hearings

The Court is striving to eliminate in-person court appearances. In the event that a hearing must go forward, the Court will attempt to conduct the hearing by video conference or telephone (with the defendant's consent in criminal cases), and the courtroom will be closed. Members of the public may call in to listen to a scheduled hearing on the phone line provided for each hearing. Any changes to scheduled hearings will be handled by the presiding judge in each case. This Order does not impact the Court's consideration of motions that can be resolved without an in-court appearance.

The Court will vacate or amend this Order no later than April 30, 2020.
