Top 10 E-Filing Errors

- 1. Wrong event selected Title of docket entry does not match title of document.
 - For example, the title on the document is "Proposed Discovery Plan" and the title of the docket entry is "Stipulation".
 - See Local Rule IC 2-2(c).

2. Multiple pleadings within one document.

- Local Rule IC 2-2(b) "...For each type of relief requested or purpose of the document, a separate document must be filed and a separate event must be selected..."
- Example: A response in opposition to a motion and a countermotion should be two separate documents and filings.

- 3. Failing to link back to related document.
 - The docket entry should hyperlink back to the motion or other document to which it pertains to (LR IC 2-2(d)).

 - See Local Rule IA 6-1(c).

- 6. The wrong form is used, or it is not on the Court's form as required by local or federal rule.
 - The wrong summons form is used.
 - The bill of costs should be on the US Court's national form.
 - Forms are found on the court's website <u>http://www.nvd.uscourts.gov/</u>

- 7. Forms not completed pursuant to the FRCP.
 - Summons is missing information like the attorney's info or multiple defendants listed on one summons.



- 10. Failure to add all parties and attorneys to the docket when a new civil case is opened.
 - Reminder messages have been added to the docketing screen.
