8	provided to the presiding judge and the parties should be entered on CM/ECF/PACER

for ease of access to these documents. These documents primarily consist of presentence investigation reports, supporting documentation and supervision records (collectively, "PSRs"). The filing of these documents does not render them public documents available for public access or for use for purposes other than sentencing. The Court will continue to protect the confidentiality of these documents by requiring that they be entered on CMECF/PACER as restricted, sealed documents. PSRs will be available to the attorneys of record for sentencing purposes only. However, the docket text related to the filing of PSRs will identify the particular document filed under seal.

In addition, the filing of the PSRs does not change the Court's policy of disclosure as articulated in Local Criminal Rule 32-2. In particular, attorneys who are granted access to the PSR may use the PSR for sentencing purposes only and may not further disclose or share the PSR. See LCR 32-2(b)(1). Counsel are not permitted to reproduce, distribute, or disclose any PSR documents, or information contained in the documents, at any other time or for any other reason, without prior, written approval from the Court. See LCR 32-2.
